INSIGHTS with Fr.Charlie

Living with Great Faith Lessons from Saint Sebastian Patron Saint of Athletes | Feast Day: January 20

Saint Sebastian was an athlete and a high ranking officer of the imperial guard in Rome under Emperor Diocletian. Once discovered to be a Christian, he was twice martyred; once by arrows, which he survived; once by clubbing. Saint Sebastian is one of the best loved among the early martyrs, in part, because he was a popular subject among the Renaissance painters. The accounts of his service and martyrdom were commemorated by St. Ambrose in Milan.

What is most significant about St. Sebastian is what we learn from the legend of how he lived in faithful service to Christ and others, using the gifts he was given. "To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for common benefit." (1 Corinthians 12:7) It was Saint Sebastian's determination, courage, and sacrifice that set him apart. He was devout in helping other Christians stay strong; most notably, to Marcellian and Mark, twin brothers who were persecuted, arrested, and martyred for their faith. St. Sebastian's empowering example converted the twins' parents, public officials, and others.

Lessons from St. Sebastian:

- Work to encourage each other in your faith, using the gifts you've been given. "From everyone who has been given much, much will be expected." (Luke 12:48)
- Be determined. "...I have won the glorious contest; I have run the race; I have kept the faith."
 (2 Timothy 4:7)
- Be compassionate. "Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful." (Luke 6:36)

How determined are you to fight for the common good?
